





'Quality Management in the design, discovery, and development of drugs from natural and synthetic origin' (20th – 25th Sep 2021)


































23rd – 25th Sep 2021: The next three days' QIP programs were organized by the Department of Pharmaceutical Quality Assurance. The registration was free and was done through MS Forms. There were more than 300 teachers registered for the program from various pharmacy colleges across India. The program was conducted online through the MS Teams (MST) platform. The program was inaugurated by Dr Satish Rao, Director of Research, Manipal Academy of Higher Education (MAHE). Principal, Manipal College of Pharmaceutical Sciences welcomed the chief guest and the gathering. Her talk introduced the importance and services of the Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission's contributions to national research. The talk has introduced the latest scenario and screening prospects included by pharmacopoeia for biologics using critical qualitative parameters for product-related substance, productrelated impurities, process-related impurities, potency, and appearance. The talk emphasized complying with IP standards, interpretation of monographs, the standard arrangement, and decoding the information in pharmacopoeia for robust research purposes. The afternoon sessions began at 2:30 PM with Mr Sudarshan Reddy (Manager at Immacule life sciences, Bangalore)

elaborating on 'Development and Evaluation of Biopharmaceutical Products'. The talk addressed topics about the process of recombinant peptide and synthetic peptide application. This was followed by a talk by Dr Subrahmanyam on 'Low-Cost Biosimilar Manufacture'. The presentation elaborated on real-life case studies on the importance of life-saving biosimilars.

The second day (7th Dec 2021) of the program began with a talk on 'Biopharmaceutical Drug Development Strategy for Targeting Brain Cancer' by Dr Rajesh Y, Research Associate, St Jude Children Research Hospital, Memphis, TN, USA. The second talk was delivered by Dr K B Harikumar, Scientist E1, Cancer Research Program, Rajiv Gandhi Centre for Biotechnology (RGCB), Thiruvananthapuram on 'Biosimilars: A Current Perspective'. 






A guest lecture hosted by the department of Pharmacology on 30th Oct 2021


30th Oct 2021: Department of Pharmacology hosted the webinar themed, 'Management of Clinical trials during COVID-19' on 30th Oct 2021 via MST from 3 to 5.30 PM IST. The speaker Phani Krishna Kondamudi deliberated on the risk and mitigation strategies for clinical studies conducted during COVID-19. Despite the travel restrictions of COVID-19, how they were able to remotely coordinate activities of clinical research across Europe was the crux of his talk. The speaker was highly appreciative of the vaccination program and digitization schemes of India, which is still in its infancy in a few European nations. Mr Kondamudi, who is the Senior Clinical Project leader at Cardiovascular European Research Centre, Massy, France shared his expertise in handling various facets of trials, viz., protocol adherence, missing data, and data integrity. He highlighted the challenges faced during the conduct of the clinical trial and the measures taken to resolve issues involving patient follow-up and modification of eCRF during deviations.

Over forty participants attended the lecture which comprised faculty from MCOPS and KMC-Mangalore, research scholars, and post-graduate students of MCOPS.



#### Guest lecture

11th Nov 2021: A guest lecture was delivered by Dr Satya Surbhi, Assistant Professor, Centre for Health System Improvement College of Medicine, UTHSC, Memphis, TN on 11th Nov 2021, on the topic 'Observational studies and pragmatic trials addressing medication non-adherence and healthcare utilization among vulnerable population'.
